Foundation employees donate again

While London Health Sciences Foundation employees have always personally donated to the hospital, five years ago they started a staff annual giving campaign. Every year since this formal campaign began, each full-time LHSF employee has made a donation supporting the hospital. This year, the LHSF Employee Family Giving Campaign was held from May 19 - 22 with 100 per cent of the 50 full-time staff signing up or renewing their pledge during the week to give back through payroll deduction - committing a total of almost \$30,000.

Some local businesses supported the campaign providing treats for the kick off and wrap up events and some gift certificates for a draw for those who increased their yearly donations.

In the five years since the annual campaign began, employees have donated close to \$135,000 towards patient care, equipment, research and education initiatives at London Health Sciences Centre.
